Build a brighter future with Home Suite Hope - Break free from poverty's grip. Defining **homelessness** is both a simple yet complex matter. Simply put, it is the lack of adequate housing, income and social supports that manifests in unique situations of living on the streets, jumping from couch to couch, being at risk of losing your housing every month, or living in a shelter.

In the grand scheme, homelessness is also the complex system of social and economic issues that permits poverty and the instability of maintaining basic needs (i.e. housing, income, health supports, etc.) within a community. It is not one or the other, but both.

As an organization, HSH provides not only a home for families who face financial difficulties, but more importantly, a support system for families looking to change their circumstances and to take back control of their own lives.


THE STORY OF JUDY

While the first post of the campaign dealt with defining homelessness, the second introduced the story of Judy ----- Judy's situation is a perfect example of Hidden Homelessness, or commonly known as "couch surfing" – temporarily living with others with no guarantee of continued residency or prospects of permanent housing. A category of homelessness that is often missed or hard to track.

ACHIEVING A MILESTONE


Home Suite Hope single parent **Leta** is currently in her first year of the Office Administration program at Sheridan College and has achieved her goal of purchasing her first starter car.

FLIGHT FOR HOPE HEADS HOME



'ROUND THE WORLD' SOLO FLIGHT IN SINGLE-ENGINE CRAFT HELPS MARGINALIZED SINGLE-PARENTS

On August 1 Oakville's **Callum Wallace** embarked on an extraordinary journey called **Flight for Hope**. This month he's due to arrive home!



Callum took off from Burlington Executive Airport, piloting a single-engine aircraft on a round-the-world journey to generate funds for **Home Suite Hope's Affordable Housing Campaign** while raising awareness globally. HSH aims to create more affordable housing in Halton.

Callum's flight has included Quebec, Iqaluit, Greenland, Iceland, Scotland, Wales, England, France, Spain and Italy. After flying to Goose Bay, Callum began his successful crossing of the North Atlantic. His flight went on to Greenland, Iceland andWales followed by England, France, Spain and Italy.

Flight for Hope hit turbulence in Greece but after a repair, Callum was back in the pilot's seat and headed to Egypt, then on to Pakistan, India, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, Samoa, and Christmas Island. This week he was in Hawaii. Callum's flight is due to conclude in Burlington in mid-October, just in time for the Home for Good Gala on November 10.

Only three Canadians have ever completed this journey. Flying around the world is no easy feat, but Callum is making it happen! HSH joins others as they rally together for Flight for Hope, Callum and his HSH fundraising efforts to help HSH create more affordable housing in Halton.

HSH COMMITTED TO EDI

NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH & RECONCILIATION

September 30 was Orange T-Shirt Day (Indigenous) and National Day for Truth and Reconciliation in Canada.

The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as



their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of 'Every Child Matters.' The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations. Across the country, local activities were organized to commemorate the history and legacy of residential schools and to participate in the day, HSH staff members attended a variety of events such as the following:

HSH partner Sheridan College offered a keynote address by Kendal Netmaker, an awardwinning entrepreneur, author, and Indigenous speaker.

The **Ontario Law Society hosted keynote speaker is Kimberly Murray**, a highly respected Indigenous leader in Canada. In June 2022, Dr. Murray was appointed by the Government of Canada as the Independent Special Interlocutor for Missing Children and Unmarked Graves and Burial Sites associated with Residential Schools.

HSH Executive Director Sara Cumming is attending the **University of Alberta**'s 12-week **Indigenous Canada** course, which examines the historical and contemporary lives, identities, cultural expressions, rights, and goals of Indigenous peoples in Canada. Indigenous voices and perspectives inform the learning experience and covers topics including: the fur trade and exchange relationships, land claims and environmental impacts, legal systems and rights, Indigenous political activism, and contemporary Indigenous life, art, and its expressions.

UNIVERSITY OF WATERLOO: RISING STAR ALUMNI DR. SARA CUMMING

Q and A with Sara J. Cumming (PhD '14 Sociology) Executive Director of Home Suite Hope and the Faculty of Arts 2023 Rising Star Alumni Award recipient

As the daughter of a single teen mom, and a former young single mother herself, Dr. Sara Cumming (PhD '14, Sociology) knows the challenges her clients face at Home Suite Hope.

As executive director of the Halton organization, Cumming designs programs to help unhoused single mothers put together the crucial pieces they need: housing, jobs, childcare and more.

Cumming's doctoral research at Waterloo laid the foundation for her work there and at Sheridan College, where she's an award-winning sociology professor.

Cumming is known for finding creative ways to build ties with the community: sourcing grocery donations for students during lockdown, brokering temporary residences at Sheridan for Ukrainian refugees.

For her current project, the Community Ideas Factory, she's working with 16 local organizations to build a life skills course that can be used and adapted by community organizations across Canada.
