



One example is **Haven to Home**, a new Ministry-funded partnership between **Home Suite Hope** and Halton Women's Place that helps domestic violence survivors transition from shelter to independent apartments where they can fully rebuild their lives.

Through wraparound supports—like subsidized childcare, life skills training, financial literacy, and access to post-secondary education—families are set up for long-term success.

Over 85% of our graduates secure employment, grow their income, and transition to full independence.


