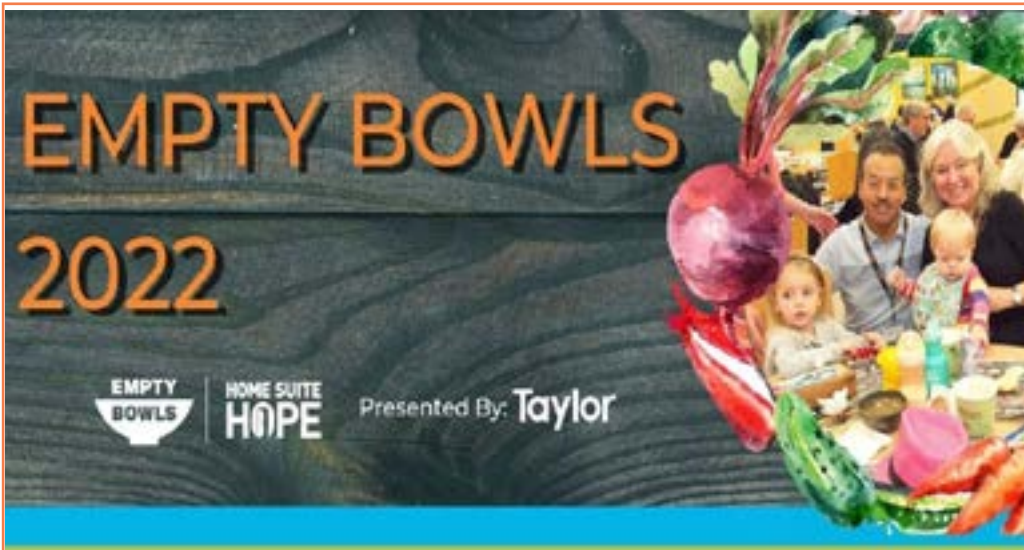

MELISSA: EMPTY BOWLS VOLUNTEER COORDINATOR

Hello, my name is **Melissa Filice** and I am happy to introduce myself to you as the **Volunteer Coordinator** for this year's annual HSH (Home Suite Hope) fundraiser, **Empty Bowls**.



I am a recent graduate of the HSH program myself and I do not know where my son and I would be today if it were not for the support and guidance I have received from HSH over these past few years. I joined HSH in August 2019, almost three months after I had given birth to my son. I remember then not knowing how I was going to sufficiently support my son alone; it was a very isolating and uncertain time for me, but my son gave me every reason I needed to want to find an answer. Home Suite Hope was our answer.

Since joining HSH my son and I quickly found our own apartment, I learned of community supports we could access, and I attended various life skill workshops, as well as was granted a full scholarship to Sheridan College for the Human Resources diploma program. I graduated with

Honors in April and completed extra courses this past summer to qualify to write the CHRP exam. I have now also graduated from being a participant of HSH and am working in the service industry while I look for employment in my field, HR. Moving forward I hope to obtain my CHRP designation and secure a full-time HR entry level job, perhaps in an HR generalist or recruitment position as I am passionate about the areas of organizational behaviour and total rewards.

If it was not for HSH and all its supports, I would have never been in a position to financially support my son and go back to school, as it is just us, we have no other outside support.

HSH gave us the chance at a fresh start, which is why I could not have been happier to accept this position with them now as the volunteer coordinator for Empty Bowls. It allows me to use some skills I have developed through my studies, such as managing the data for all volunteers, and to give back to a program that has given my son and I so much. I plan to always give back to HSH moving forward and help other single moms get their fresh start as we work hard to overcome intergenerational hardships and give our children the best possible future that they deserve.

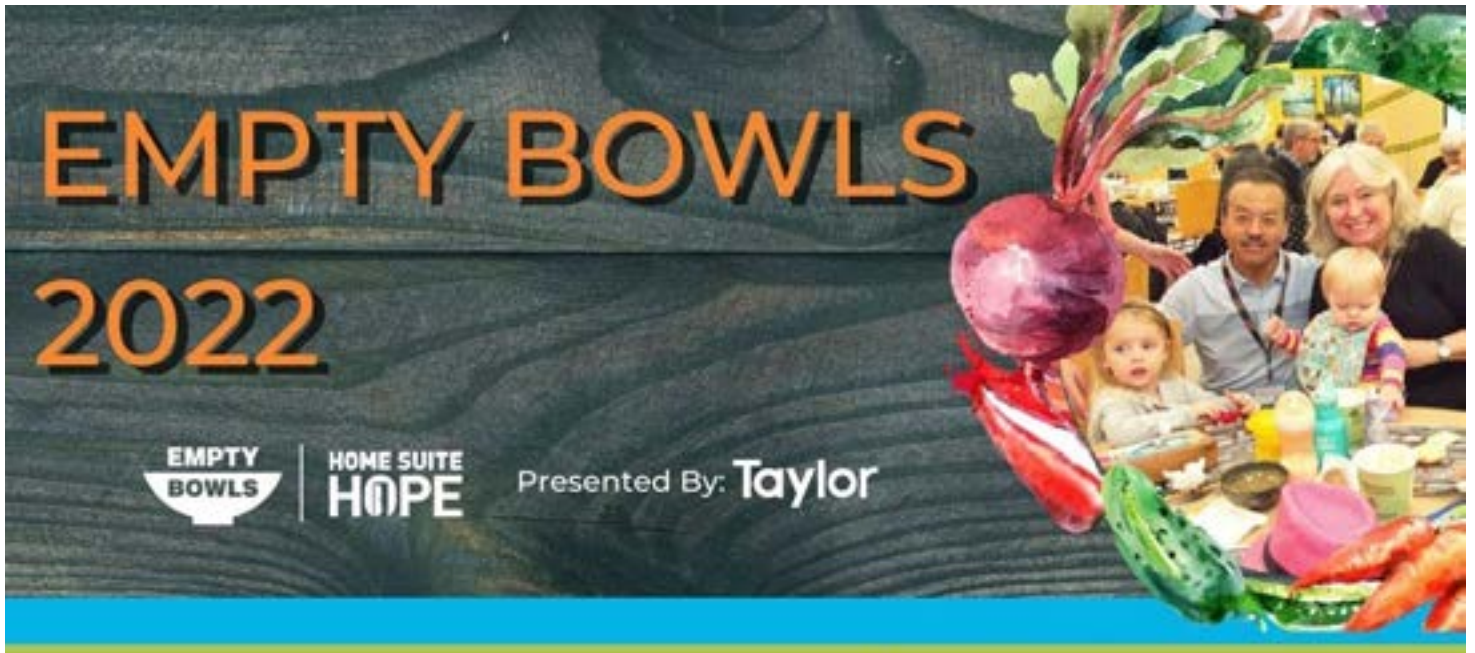

Dear

My name is Robin. I'm a 34-year-old, single parent in Home Suite Hope's (HSH) Homeward Bound Halton program. I'd like to share my story to show how your support of HSH changes the lives of local families.

My daughter, Leanne, is 12 years old. She has a radiant smile and loves being around others. At 3-months old, Leanne was diagnosed with Hirschsprung's Disease which required surgery, during surgery she flatlined which resulted in brain injury, and she was subsequently diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy. As a result, Leanne is quadriplegic and requires fulltime, total care.

Our life has been a rollercoaster. In 2014, we moved to Canada from Antigua. When Leanne was born, I had no network of support to help with her special needs. It was just us.

There's nothing I wouldn't do for my daughter, but the challenges in our daily life seemed insurmountable and we started to slip further and further through the social safety net cracks.

For her entire life, I've carried Leanne up and down the stairs to our basement apartment — even as she aged to a tween. There was no other option. This was our reality.

In 2020 at the beginning of COVID, Leanne and I were accepted into Home Suite Hope and our lives began to change. They helped us find accessible housing, allowed Leanne and I to have separate rooms for the first time ever, and secured the proper lifts to transport Leanne into and out of bed and the shower.

My dream is to provide for my family by finding a full-time IT job. Through HSH, I'm now taking a Computer Systems Technician – Software Engineering program at Sheridan College. Soon, full-time employment will be within my grasp.

HSH, despite the complexity of our needs, is giving Leanne and I a real chance in life.

Housing and transportation costs strain everyone, but you can imagine the additional burden for parents like myself when everything must be fully accessible. HSH is determined to help us secure a better future. Case and point: while funding is available to retrofit a vehicle to make it accessible, I must first have the vehicle. So, HSH is helping me save towards a used pre-converted van.

THANK YOU TO EVERYONE WHO DUG IN AT BLUEBERRY FIELDS IN 2022

With the holidays fast approaching, we begrudgingly admit our community garden, **Blueberry Fields**, will take a rest for the winter.

But not without celebrating a wonderful season!

After activities were scaled back, hampered by the pandemic and limitations on volunteer numbers over the last few years, this summer saw the garden, nestled behind the **Upper Oakville Shopping Centre**, a hub of activity once again.

Recently, the Home Suite Hope team was on-site to help with the annual close-down chores. The evidence of a busy season was all around. Straggler potatoes and carrots were unearthed as beds were tilled and raked for the winter, and garden **Manager Ken Stockstill** was still getting every bit out of the garden as he had the HSH team planting garlic for a quick turnaround harvest.



Ken is with the Upper Oakville Shopping Centre. The garden, nestled just behind that mall, was founded by Ken, who manages it in addition to his role at the shopping centre as a labour of love. He is assisted by **Ruth Borst**, a retired librarian and long-time Halton resident, who manages the volunteers who work the garden all season – in conjunction with **Kim Hutchison** from the mall. The garden's harvest is distributed to those in need – including single families in Home Suite Hope's (HSH) program, and the general community – through **Kerr Street Mission (KSM)**.

The 5,000 sq. ft. garden, has 2,000 sq. ft. of growing space in nearly two dozen planter beds – and successfully turns out a bounty of potatoes, cabbage, zucchini, lettuce, beans, rhubarb, green onions and more. It also grows items like kale, tomatoes, herbs and berries. Ken said seeds are sown according to the concept that whatever can go into a stew, can go into the garden. There are carrots, peppers, onions, zucchini, cucumbers, cabbages, even butternut squash.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT



The HSH staff team was at the garden recently to pitch in – just as local neighbours and corporate volunteer groups, who want to give back to the community, do all season long.

Volunteer teams from **Sagen** (formerly Genworth Canada) and **Ian Martin Group** have been pitching in to grow yields far above expectations for years. They were back again this season – in their corporate T-shirts and with music to entertain them while they worked.

It is these volunteer efforts, supervised by Ruth and Ken, which make the garden a success story and make recipes come to life on local dinner tables.

Home Suite Hope would be remiss if it did not, at the end of yet another successful growing season, extend heartfelt thanks to Ken, Ruth and the many volunteers, individual and corporate, who help our garden grow. **Thank you for all that you do!**
