

HSH is fortunate to be able to off our Homeward Bound Halton participants a two-year bursary to Sheridan College - and through some additional grants tuition to alternative studies.

HSH participants, with the assistance of its Industry Council volunteer representatives - business people in the community who help our participants navigate the job search and networking upon graduation - pursue diplomas in areas known to offer stable employment and income.

The 2024 GIVEOakville Campaign inspired nearly \$1 million for local charities, including Home Suite Hope (HSH). In 2024, GIVEOakville raised more than \$860,000, which was donated through the campaign, and inspired a further \$86,000 from Foundation Fundholders, who directed additional grants to GIVEOakville charities during the campaign. Altogether \$946,000 was directed to Oakville charities.

Research shows that access to reliable transportation is a game-changer. It opens doors to better-paying jobs, education, essential services, and fuller participation in community life. For the single-parents in our programming, owning a car is more than convenience — it's the key to independence.

That's why we continue to run our **Drive to Thrive** initiative to help our families gain mobility and freedom. You can help us get there:

- **Donate**: Fund driving lessons, safety inspections, insurance, or a tank of gas.
- Gift a Vehicle: Have an underused car? Donate it to transform a family's future.
- Partner with Us: Car dealerships and driving schools can offer vehicles or discounted services.
