#### THE LIVING WAGE CHALLENGE

As of Jan. 1, 2023, Home Suite Hope became a living wage employer in Halton. As of May, HSH confirmed the official designation of this important milestone with accreditation with the **Ontario Living Wage Network**.

This milestone was important for HSH to reach and has real world and symbolic significance that extends far beyond our doors, according to HSH Executive Director Sara Cumming.

Sara noted we could not have made this leap without the support of our donors, who are not only champions of supporting single-parent families, but who are also vocal and passionate about us setting the example we want to see in the rest of the world.

Halton Region is one of the most expensive places to live in Canada and by committing to be a living wage employer we are strengthening and stabilizing the workforce of our community. We are also signalling to the community that HSH is a leader in best practices. We aren't holding others to any standard that we ourselves aren't willing to also meet and that is a mission-critical message to send, says Sara.

Breaking the cycle of poverty can often feel like an overwhelming goal — sometimes the challenges appear insurmountable. If our community knows they have a true partner in Home Suite Hope — that we are working just as hard as they are to make a difference inside and outside of our organization — then the big asks we make for their support, advocacy and mentorship for our families are less daunting," says Sara.
