



## **INDIGENOUS HISTORY MONTH**



June is National Indigenous History Month in Canada, a time to recognize the rich history, heritage, resilience and diversity of First Nations, Inuit and Métis.

#### **CASSANDRA'S STORY**

Sheridan College Social Service Worker (SSW) intern Cassandra Charles joined HSH in January as a new practicuum student. "I am an outgoing, but shy individual, who comes from a mostly Indigenous background with a little European in there. I have also played soccer my whole life, as it is one of my biggest passions. I am all about hearing people's stories and keeping an open mind to life's journey and providing the best case management support to HSH families."





Cassandra, a 20-year-old Sheridan College SSW student has been with HSH since January 2024. As she works towards obtaining her diploma and gaining social work experience with the HSH team, her future hope is to build a career serving and supporting Indigenous Peoples and the Indigenous Community.

She shared challenges the Indigenous community often face, mentioning, "My mom said the people often struggle and do not have the resources and mental health supports they need."

Cassandra recognizes her Indigenous heritage through her Dad, of the Chippewas of Geogina Island, an Anishnaabe Nation. However, she also credits her mom, who is of European decent, for being instrumental in fostering her relationship with her Indigenous identity. Her mother stays in touch with Patti Big Canoe, an Education Lead, who helps Cassandra navigate the complexities of her Indigenous identity and engages in discussions of how it relates to her studies.

## **INDIGENOUS HISTORY MONTH**

Being proud and open about her Indigenous identity was not always true for Cassandra. While she has fond memories of her paternal grandma's home adorned with pictures of wolves and dreamcatchers, there was not a lot of exposure to her culture nor a connect to her community. Upon learning of her own roots, Cassandra didn't find any particular meaning to her identity, expressing, "When I was young, I didn't think it mattered... a background is a background."



However, as time passed, Cassandra not only became curious, but began to notice patterns and barriers in her everyday experience, especially in her years of high school and college. From the tiresome comments like, "You don't look Indigenous," to navigating rules surrounding her rights to her Indigenous Status for not just herself but future children when pursuing being legally adopted by a non-Indigenous father figure, to hearing more about land acknowledgements and Indigenous history.

Cassandra found resources through Sheridan's Centre of Indigenous Learning and Support, and has been grateful for additional resources she's come to learn of while working at HSH and with Indigenous clients. Cassandra is eager to learn more about her history and community, and is excited of the prospects for building a future career.


#### SARA SPEAKS TO ROTARY

## HSH AT BURLINGTON MAYOR'S EVENT

On May 27 at the Burlington Performing Arts Centre, **Burlington Mayor** 

Marianne Meed Ward launched a Speaker Series with an event focused on affordable housing featuring guest speaker Jennifer Keesmaat. HSH's Director of Operations Catherine Villasenor represented Home Suite Hope at the event and the preceding tradeshow of industry experts and community groups, including HSH, the Halton Region and Habitat for Humanity.

The event featured the Mayor and Deputy Mayor for Business and Red Tape Reduction Councillor Kelvin Galbraith, with urban planner Jennifer Keesmaat, who was named one of the "most powerful people in Canada" by Maclean's, one of the "most influential" by Toronto Life, and one of the top Women of Influence in Canada. Jennifer spent five years as the City of Toronto's Chief City Planner, where she was celebrated for her forward thinking and collaborative approach to city-building.

Event attendees were updated on upcoming housing, community development and growth projects in Burlington, but also challenged with envisioning a city where affordable housing existed and housing was accessible to everyone – not a reality of today, but absolutely attainable in the future if we adopted more innovative ways of addressing housing, used land efficiently, built homes based on the need, and focused on eliminating the need for shelters and transitional housing.

The event was called Making Housing Affordable: What We Can Do in Burlington.

## EMPLOYMENT WORKSHOP

On May 29, HSH hosted a Welcome to the Employment Phase Workshop at the Centre for Skills Development in Burlington. Facilitated by HSH Program Manager Nikkian Hanson-Daley, it introduced graduating participants to the employment phase of HSH's program. The workshop included an employment preparation presentation regarding intensive job search and was attended by members of the Industry Council, HSH student interns and caseworkers. HSH participants also gave a quick 'elevator

pitch' to the Industry Council members about why they should be hired, and received feedback from the council and HSH employees. Staff at the Centre gave a tour of the on-site Resource Centre and a presentation about the services and support offered there.

Home Suite Hope hosted a Life Skills youth-informed Investments and Financial Literacy Workshop on Friday, May 17 at the YMCA of Oakville. The session was facilitated by Donna McKenzie and Shara Carr from S.O.S Financial Group.

Attendees took advantage of the opportunity to learn various financial literacy skills and tips on planning for



themselves and their families. A range of topics was presented to the audience, such as: building their financial house, budgeting, methods to debt elimination and the importance of investing in savings accounts and diverse investment plans.

#### SUPPORT FOR SPECIAL PROJECTS

included the summer Cabin Retreat weekend that offered participants a weekend camp trip, the Running on Empty campaign to help with rising gas prices, the fundraising efforts that helped HSH secure an accessible vehicle to transport the mom of a quadriplegic child so they could

participate in HSH festivities, or the pilot project that brought an in-house psychotherapist and since

has proven in-house psychotherapy supports encourage active program participation and better access to mental health supports.

All of these projects and needs have been fulfilled thanks to the continued support of our community and champions, such as the Zonta Club of Oakville, the Lions Club of Oakville, and individual donors (long-time and new) who continue to answer the call and fuel the needs of the participant and organization.
