



Clients who completed HSH programs in 2024 are 90% able to sustain market rent independently.

### **HOUSING INFO SESSION**

### **SAFE & AFFORDABLE HOUSING NEEDED**

On September 23 at Port Nelson Church in Burlington, **Garth Brown**, from **Mary's Ark Homes**, brought together organizations and individuals from the Halton community for a housing information session.

During this session, community members gained information about existing opportunities that property owners can utilize on their own property to help their neighbours within Halton. The session also highlighted the recent provincial government-funded partnership between **Halton Women's Place** (one of the presenters) and **Home Suite Hope** and their new joint **Haven** to **Home** (H2H) program, and underscored the prevalence of need within the community for safe spaces for families to rebuild.

Home Suite Hope's Executive Director Dr. Sara Cumming presented and shared information on HSH programs and H2H and the importance of safe and affordable housing for people in Halton. HSH Caseworker Haley Weber was also in attendance while community member Andrea graciously shared her story to underscore the impact that safe and affordable housing has on families who are rebuilding.

Home Suite Hope supports single-parent-led families in their journey from poverty to stability. Now, with new by-laws permitting detached homes in most backyards, your property could help create a safe, affordable space for a family to thrive.

Our participants have overcome significant challenges, including:

Yet they move forward with resilience and determination, striving to give their children a better future.

One example is **Haven to Home**, a new Ministry-funded partnership between **Home Suite Hope** and **Halton Women's Place** that helps domestic violence survivors transition from shelter to independent apartments where they can fully rebuild their lives.

Through wraparound supports—like subsidized childcare, life skills training, financial literacy, and access to post-secondary education—families are set up for long-term success.

Over **85% of our graduates** secure employment, grow their income, and transition to full independence.

## STAFF UPDATES A SPRINKLE FOR CATHERINE


### **CONGRATS!**

Alison comes to this placement as a second career student, with a background in economics from Queen's University and a career spent primarily in risk management and process improvement design. While her professional path has followed a corporate route until now, Alison has always had a strong desire to be part of a helping profession.

Born in New Brunswick, but spending most of her childhood in London, Ontario.

Alison now resides in Oakville with her husband and their son Everett (and two Scottish fold cats). When not working or studying, Alison usually can be found at a rink, where her family spends most of the fall and winter cheering on her son's hockey

team. Growing up, Alison was deeply influenced by her father, who worked in social services and was very engaged with marginalized communities. Each day, they navigate long, unpredictable commutes across town, juggling daycare drop-offs, work shifts, and classes. In communities like Halton, where public transit is limited, a missed bus can mean a missed opportunity — or worse, a lost job.

Research shows that access to reliable transportation is a game-changer. It opens doors to better-paying jobs, education, essential services, and fuller participation in community life. For the single-parents in our programming, owning a car is more than convenience — it's the key to independence.

That's why we've launched the **Drive to Thrive** initiative to help our families gain mobility and freedom. You can help us get there:


- **Donate**: Fund driving lessons, safety inspections, insurance, or a tank of gas.
