## HOME FOR THE HOLIDAYS THANKS TO ARGO

Two HSH Oakville families were 'home' for the holidays – and it was a wish come true.

At the holidays, we often don't realize how far typical seasonal activities are from the reality being experienced by some members of our own community. For those fleeing domestic violence for safety or others with just the clothes on their backs, the two worlds are so far apart, wishes can't bridge them.

This holiday however, two single moms in Home Suite Hope (HSH) programming were able to call a brand-new townhome in north Oakville 'home' thanks to the generosity of Burlington-based ARGO Development Corp.

With the backing of HSH and support from others in the community, they not only have a roof over their heads... but a cozy bed and a mother's wish realized to provide, not just a safe haven, but a home, for her children.

ARGO has built communities throughout Halton including Alton Village and Millcroft Greens, Orianna Glen, Bronte Green, Westoak Trails and Joshua Creek. It has supplied these two townhomes in north central Oakville to the HSH participants at reduced rental rates. This generous builder also provided all window coverings and beds for the units and then topped it off with towels and \$700 in gift cards.

The moms and their children are thrilled. One of the moms was coming straight out of homelessness. She has three children and is just starting her programming journey with HSH. "This home means safety, stability, and a chance to grow. It's a fresh chapter—a place where we can create new memories, strengthen our bond, and move forward with hope and confidence," she said. "For me, it represents relief from constant stress and the opportunity to build routines and structure for my children. For my kids, this townhouse means having their own space, a consistent environment to learn and play, and a place where they can feel secure," she added.

The other single parent – mom to a teen son and daughter - is well underway in HSH programming with the goal of working in the healthcare field. She and her children are ending this year on a high note as they also celebrated becoming Canadian citizens earlier this year.

## HOMES BEGIN A NEW CHAPTER FOR FAMILIES



**"F**oremost, I believe in God and this home signifies that God sees our innermost desires and answers prayers. My children and I have always desired a house. We have always wondered when and how we would get the opportunity to move into one, but I had no clue on how that would be possible. Given my current income and financial situation, I did not foresee it happening anytime soon," she said.

"When I got the news that a new townhouse unit has been assigned to me, it felt so unreal, too good to be true. I kept doubting the reality until I signed the lease agreement! It is so exciting for me and my children to be spending the holidays in a townhouse, coming from basements and two-bedroom apartments. It gives us a deeper sense of belonging and settlement in Canada. This comes in the same year – 2025 – that we became Canadian citizens," she added.

Making families feel at home is what drove **ARGO Founder Gord Buck** into the business. He founded ARGO in 1999 after running his own building company in western Canada and then bringing his vision to Toronto to focus on land development, his true passion. Gord launched ARGO based on the values of honesty, transparency, commitment to excellence and a desire to always do your best.

"At ARGO, we've always believed in supporting the communities we develop in. Oftentimes this means building parks before the first homeowner moves in, or donating to local recreation clubs and sports teams, hospitals and hospices. This initiative, however, is much more personal. Our founders, Gord and his wife Babette, were both raised by single moms," said **Adine Carter, ARGO's Vice President Corporate Affairs**.



"Many of our employees were raised by single moms or are/were single moms themselves. We know how hard this situation can be, and in today's economy it's nearly impossible to survive on one income. The moms we are supporting with this initiative have endured more than any woman should have to, and we want to do what we can to help them and their families achieve their dreams, with full and happy lives. We are honoured to partner with Home Suite Hope and make meaningful changes to families who live in our communities," Adine continued.



# ARGO HOMES BRING LIFE-CHANGING IMPACT

It has built a wide portfolio of residential and commercial projects throughout the Greater Toronto Area. One was raising a teen and an eight-year-old in a one-bedroom unit; another was sharing a single room with her three children. Today, they describe this opportunity as nothing short of a Christmas miracle. ARGO's generosity hasn't just opened doors — it has restored dignity, stability, and hope," said **Sara Cumming, Executive Director, Home Suite Hope**.

**HSH Caseworker Haley Weber**, who counsels the two moms involved in this new partnership can attest to its impact already.

"Your generosity with these families, has had a profound impact. Securing these new, beautiful, and completely their own spaces has been transformative for these single-mother families, arriving just in time for the holidays. The impact extends far beyond the physical walls," noted Haley. "For mothers who have known the profound stress and instability of homelessness or precarious housing, this security is a foundation upon which they can finally rebuild. The mental and emotional load of constant survival mode begins to lift, freeing up bandwidth to focus on nurturing their children, planning for the future, and simply breathing. For the children, it means the profound gift of stability — a safe place to call home, a reliable space to do homework, and the joyous opportunity to create holiday memories in a space that is not temporary or shared. This housing is not just shelter; it is the first, crucial step toward healing, dignity, and the chance to thrive as a family unit," said Haley.

Happy Holidays to the single parents and their children in our program, to the generous people at ARGO for making this initiative a reality and for the always-present support of the Halton community... wishes do come true!

## SARA'S MESSAGE FOR 2026

**Dear Home Suite Hope Supporters,**

As we welcome a new year, I find myself reflecting on just how far we have come together—and how profoundly grateful I am for the community that surrounds our families, our staff, and our mission.

2024 was not an easy year. Rising housing costs and fiscal pressures forced us to make incredibly difficult decisions in 2025, including reducing the number of participants in our programs and preparing for potential staffing cuts. It was a moment that could have signaled

contraction. Instead, thanks to your support, your belief in us, and the extraordinary resilience of our team, 2025 became one of the most transformational in our history.

In direct alignment with our strategic plan, we expanded our programming in ways that truly changed what is possible for single parents in Halton.

We opened two new programs — **Pathways Forward** and **Haven to Home** — so that single mothers and fathers who do not qualify for **Homeward Bound** still have a path toward stability and self-sufficiency. With these additions, we more than doubled the number of families we serve in a single year. For the first time, we welcomed single dads and working single parents into our programming, allowing us to meet long-standing needs that too often went unseen.

This growth was made possible by opportunities we once could only hope for. We secured new grants—some that we had never before qualified for. We established new affordable housing partnerships, adding three units this year: one with **One Urban** and two with **Argo Development Corporation**. We also advanced an ambitious partnership to secure 25 affordable units in Oakville, a project that promises to change the future for generations of families. Already, we have welcomed 43 participants into our programs, with more than 21 additional families waiting to join us before March.

None of this progress was guaranteed. In fact, we ended 2024 with our first financial loss in seven years. Options were narrowing, and the uncertainty around housing funding cast a shadow over our plans. But thanks to the extraordinary work of our grant writing and development teams — led by **Grant Strategies & Solutions** — and thanks to our partnership with **Halton Women's Place**, we experienced a remarkable upswing. We nearly doubled our program capacity and have been able to bring on new staff to support the growth we once weren't sure we could sustain.

## READY FOR THE CHALLENGES OF 2026

Even with this momentum, important work lies ahead. We have made tremendous strides in rejuvenating our **Board**, but we must now turn our attention to growing **mentorship** and **Industry Council** volunteer networks beyond Oakville. Third-party events were a great success this past year, but continuing to strengthen these efforts will be essential for meeting our 2026 strategic targets. And while we secured a much-needed \$40,000 increase to our housing subsidy allotment, we know that once the Oakville partnership is complete, we will require \$360,000 annually to sustain that level of support.

Through every challenge and every triumph, one thing has remained constant: the strength and heart of our community.

To our **staff** — thank you for the tireless, frontline work you do every day.

To our **donors** — your generosity keeps our doors open and our programs alive.

To our **community partners** and **event hosts** — thank you for standing with us.

To our **participants** — your courage and determination inspire everything we do.

And to you, our **supporters**, thank you for believing in this mission so deeply.

As we step into 2026, I ask that you continue to keep Home Suite Hope close to your heart. Please consider championing us within your companies' social responsibility committees, hosting donation drives throughout the year for gift cards, cleaning supplies, and feminine hygiene products, and helping us spread the word about the urgent need for volunteer mentors and industry partners.

Your support — consistent, year-round — makes all the difference. Together, we have accomplished what once felt impossible. Together, we will continue building a community where every single parent has the opportunity to move from crisis to stability — and from stability to hope.

## ALL WRAPPED UP

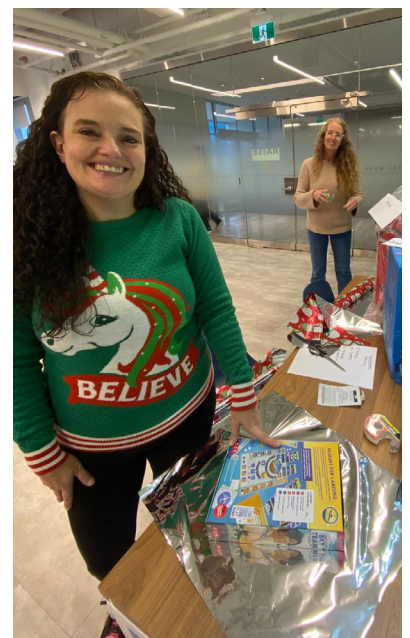
**H**SH owes thank-yous for putting a beautiful wrap on the holidays from the gift wrapping efforts of numerous local businesses and agencies.

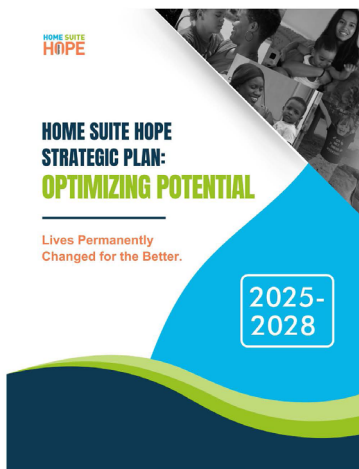


# THE MILESTONES OF 2025

As Home Suite Hope welcomed 2025, the year ahead was fraught with challenges. HSH ended 2024 with its first financial loss in seven years and options were narrowing as uncertainty around housing funding cast a shadow over plans.

Rising housing costs and fiscal pressures forced HSH to make some very tough calls, including reducing the number of participants in its programs and preparing for potential staffing cuts. HSH was staring down contraction.

However the extraordinary work of our grant writing and development teams — led by **Grant Strategies & Solutions** — and a new partnership with **Halton Women's Place (HWP)**, HSH experienced a remarkable turnaround.



By the end of 2025, HSH had nearly doubled its program capacity and had brought on new staff to support the growth. 2025 became one of the most transformational in HSH's history — after having marked its 20th anniversary in 2024.

HSH opened two new programs — **Pathways Forward** and **Haven to Home** — so that single mothers and fathers who do not qualify for our flagship four-year Homeward Bound Halton program still have a path toward stability and self-sufficiency. With these additions, we more than doubled the number of families we serve in a single year.

For the first time, we welcomed single dads and working single parents into our programming, allowing us to meet long-standing needs. The growth saw HSH secure new grants — some that we had never before qualified for. By year's end, we had welcomed 41 participants into our programs, with more than 10 additional families waiting to join us in early 2026.

HSH also established new affordable housing partnerships, adding three units in 2025: one with **One Urban** and two with **ARGO Development Corp.** HSH also advanced an ambitious partnership to secure 25 affordable units in Oakville, a project that promises to change the future for generations of families.

HSH is on track for its **Strategic Plan 2025-2028**, and has made strides in rejuvenating its **Board**. HSH's volunteer Board welcomed **Robyn Pangman, a partner at Henderson Partners LLP, Shalu Bains, Executive Vice President, Performance and Planning & Chief Information and Analytics Officer at Trillium Health Partners; Amanpreet Dhillon, Area Director for Homecare Solutions overseeing the Mississauga-Halton Region and Lindsay Anderson, Associate Dean for Nursing at Mohawk College.**





# REFLECTING ON 2025

**Third-party events** were a great success this past year, but continuing to strengthen these efforts will be essential for meeting our 2026 strategic targets. We secured a much-needed \$40,000 increase to our housing subsidy allotment, we know that once the Oakville partnership is complete, we will require \$360,000 annually to sustain that level of support. Home Suite Hope's **2025-2028 Strategic Plan**, a blueprint for the impactful and compassionate work that lies ahead was introduced in early 2025.

HSH Home Suite Hope nominated **Peter Kolisnyk** for the **Realtors Who Care Award** early in 2025 and wrapped up the year as long-time HSH supporter **Bonnie Jackson** was recognized with the **Oakville Community Foundation's Adrian Coote Volunteer Award**.

Executive Director Sara Cumming was busy in the community in 2025, creating awareness of HSH at **Sagen Canada, St. Mildred's-Lightbourn School, Appleby College**, a variety of **Rotary Clubs in Oakville** and the **100th anniversary Rotary Gala**, United Way Halton-Hamilton and more.

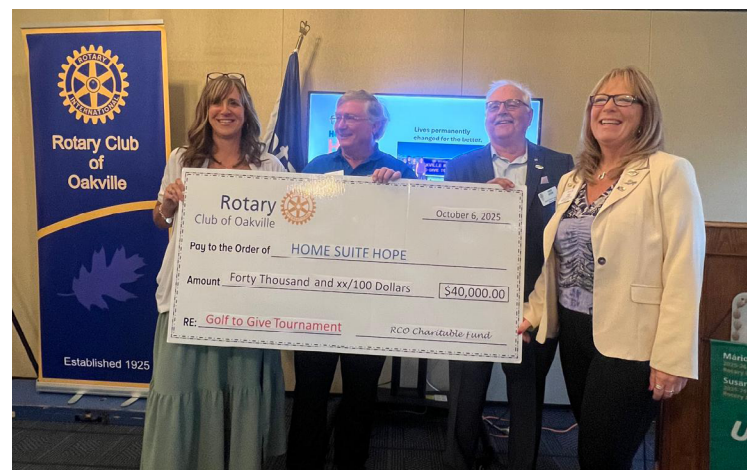


Program staff was also out in the community attending International Women's Day events, an Oakville Chamber of Commerce speakers' series, community forums, trade shows and resource fairs in Burlington and more. In April, was recognized by the **United Way Halton & Hamilton (UWHH) with a Game Changer Award** for its success in finding creative ways to connect and engage their employed within their workplace campaign, to ensure community needs were met.

In May, HSH saw the return of its **Luxury Bingo** event held at **Oakville Pump & Patio**. It also launched its **Drive to Thrive** campaign that continues in efforts to support the transportation needs of participants. In June, HSH was beneficiary of a **Yoga in the Park** event in Burlington thanks to Industry Council connection **Audrey Bailey**. In late summer, **Penalta** chose Home Suite Hope as its Charity of Choice for the locally-based company's **Annual Boat Cruise**. It was also during the summer that HSH formed a partnership with **Koa & Kind**, which continues to donate \$1 from every candle sold to HSH.

Participant socials included adventures in **Extreme Cooking**, a cooking workshop, Mother's Day donations, a summer social and employment preparedness workshops.

The September **Oakville Rotary Golf to Give** **ournament** was a big win for HSH as it raised \$40,000 – a much needed boost.



# THE MILESTONES OF 2025

2025 brought staffing changes to HSH, too. In June, HSH hired **Dayna Ramawad** as its new **Community Resource Coordinator**. By year's end, Dayna was a caseworker and HSH had welcomed **Kennedy Apold** as lead caseworker for the **Haven to Home** program. **Madison Apold** interned and then joined HSH's as its new **Program Coordinator/Content Creator**. While **HSH Program Manager Nikkian Hanson-Daley** returned from maternity leave in the summer, **HSH Director of Operations Catherine Villasenor** left on maternity leave as she welcomed her second son, **Atlas**, in the fall. **Nikkian** then stepped up as **Interim Director of Operations**.



**HSH Executive Director Sara Cumming** represented Sheridan College and the values we uphold at HSH on the international stage as she travelled to **Rabat, Morocco** to present at the **International Sociology Association (ISA) Forum**, leading a session titled 'Clinical Sociology and the Anthropocene: Community Engaged Approaches to Solving Real-World Issues.'

Our annual **Back-to-school Backpack Project** got a huge helping hand from **Kerr Street Mission's** young **Leaders in Training**. HSH was at the **UWHH Plane Pull** campaign kickoff for the second year and was instrumental at a Housing Information Session held by **Garth Brown** and **Mary's Ark** in Burlington exploring affordable housing options in the community.



**Global Heroes**, North America's premier positive news magazine, featured HSH and an interview with Sara in August and Sara was regularly interviewed for reports in **InsideHalton** and **Oakville News** publications as inflation and the affordable housing crisis raged on.

HSH celebrated the success of its participants, too, those who graduated from **Sheridan College** studies and secured employment, a skilled trades grad

and a participant who, along with her children, became Canadian citizens.

After a successful **Empty Bowls** event at **Appleby College**, HSH was into its **Hope 4 Holidays** campaign. As usual, the end of the year was frantic with holiday gift deliveries, donations and the usual bustle of the season. It was led off as two participants moved into brand new townhomes in Oakville – supplied to HSH at reduced rates by **ARGO Development Corp.** The local developer went over and above, also donating all window coverings, beds and gift cards for move-in purchases for our families.



HSH remains grateful to those who supported HSH at special events, at the holidays and throughout the year. Your kindness and generosity in sharing helps bring warmth, dignity, and a sense of hope to parents and children as they navigate a challenging journey from poverty and crisis to stability.



# HSH IN THE COMMUNITY

## NEW: HAVEN TO HOME (H2H)

Thanks to funding from the Ontario government and in partnership with Halton Women's Place (HWP), Home Suite Hope welcomed a new program, Haven 2 Home (H2H).

This program became a reality in July 2025 and offers specialized support for individuals impacted by gender-based violence.

H2H assists program participants to secure affordable, safe housing and provides up to one year of rental subsidy.

It also offers wraparound support that includes life skills training and workshops, employment and professional development supports, landlord engagement and housing navigation and personalized client-driven case management.

Eligibility is for those eligible for services from Halton Women's Place, must identify as a single woman with or without children, be over 18 years old and must be eligible to receive income supports and or have secure employment.

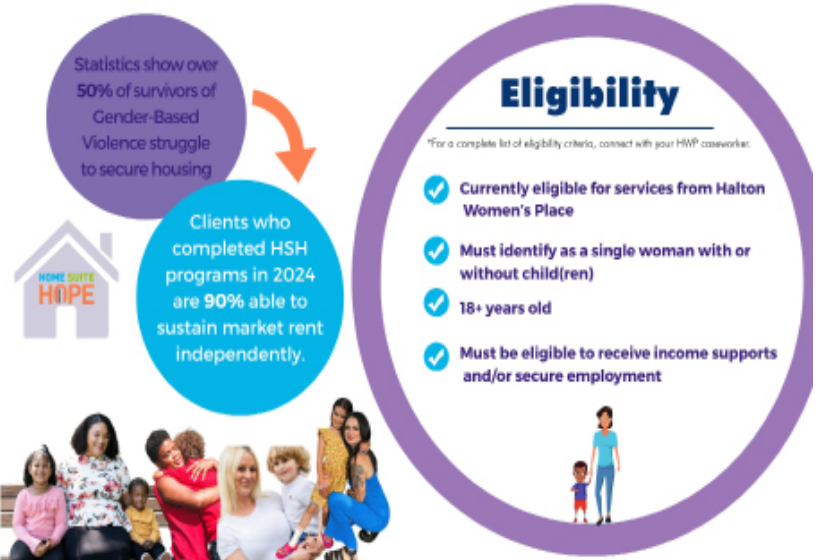
