SOS: RUNNING ON EMPTY!

FILLING THE NEED

HSH launched an emergency transportation campaign – Running on Empty - to help our families with rising gas and transportation costs in June.

The campaign began with a week-long Matching Challenge and will continue throughout the summer.

So far - thanks to the generous support from the community kicked off by the outstanding response to the Matching Challenge - the \$25,000 campaign is nearing the \$15,000 mark.



Our participant single parents are facing steeper challenges as they work to move from poverty to stability, as rising transportation costs are proving to be a real hindrance.

While HSH helps families with rental subsidies, a post-secondary bursary, childcare costs and case management, rising transportation costs are impeding their ability to get to school, grocery store or food bank, work, childcare and case management and life skills meetings.

Our \$25,000 campaign launched with a **Matching Challenge** – for every \$1 that was donated between June 22 and June 29, 2022, it was matched by **an anonymous supporter, who provided \$5,000 in matching funds**. The Matching Challenge was taken home by a \$2,500 donation from the **Willis Family through the Aqueduct Foundation** and **Bonnie and Terry Jackson through The Jackson Family Foundation Fund at the Oakville Community Foundation**. FIRST HARVEST AT GARDEN

A big vote of thanks to those volunteers, who have braved the scorching temperatures this summer to help harvest potatoes, carrots, beans and zucchini from HSH's Community Garden Blueberry Fields at Upper Oakville Shopping Centre.

A whole bed of carrots and a bed of potatoes - about 30 kg of potatoes and 15 kg carrots, a large box of beans and several boxes of huge zucchini were harvested and taken Kerr Street Mission where HSH participants and members of the public can access the fresh produce.
