



# CELEBRATING EID

**E**id begins the evening of Monday, May 2 and ends the evening of Tuesday, May 3. Eid marks the end of Ramadan, the Muslim holy month of fasting.

Eid al-Fitr (also referred to as Eid-ul-Fitar) is actually the second Eid celebration and follows Ramadan, during which Muslims fast for 29-30 days, and then celebrate Eid with family and friends by preparing meals and giving and receiving gifts, according to HSH participant **Tayyaba**. "We celebrate two Eid. The first celebration, Ed-ul-adha is after a sacrifice and Eid prayers for the sake of Allah (God) and for less fortunate people, explained Tayyaba.

"The word 'Eid' means 'feast' or 'festival.' Eid Al Fitr is a religious holiday that marks the end of Ramadan, the Muslim holy month of fasting. Fasting is considered an act of worship during this month and a chance for Muslims to be more compassionate to the needy, practice patience and get closer to the Almighty," said HSH participant **Syeda**.

## THANK YOU SASHA


**H**ome Suite Hope extends a thank-you to **Sasha Gay Hanson** for her participation on its Board in 2021.

# HSH HOUSING PROJECT

**H**ome Suite Hope is among 29 applicants across Canada chosen to participate in the **CMHC (Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation)-led Housing Supply Challenge**.

The Challenge aims to reduce barriers to housing supply and affordability so by 2030 everyone in Canada has a home that meets their needs and that they can afford. Halton is home to the most expensive housing in Ontario.



HSH graduates despite earning approximately \$50,000 starting salaries still struggle financially when faced with an average \$2,200 monthly rental rate for a two-bedroom unit in Halton – if they can find a suitable unit.

HSH is consulting with single-parent families to bring their voice to the table on what design and cost represents effective affordable housing for them and is collaborating with private, public and non-profit partners, to bring to life an affordable housing prototype in Halton and beyond.

## TAKE IN A CONCERT






# FAREWELL TO OUR STUDENT INTERNS

## LOTS OF OPPORTUNITIES

### **Blueberry Fields Community Garden (Seasonal) - May through October**

Volunteers work in the community garden doing weeding, planting, harvesting, etc. spring through September.

### **Empty Bowls Annual Fundraiser – mid-to-late October**

Volunteers help packing soup kits prior to delivery and/or help in delivering soups according to predetermined routes.

### **Hope4Holidays Annual Holiday Fundraiser – late November to mid-December**

Volunteer groups could sponsor a family by purchasing gifts for family members as outlined on a wish list from the family or help with gift wrapping gifts prior to delivery.

### **Calls to Action**

Groups can assist with specific calls to action, as needed, to meet needs that arise ie. Collection of toiletries, cleaning supplies, gift cards.

We welcome experienced individuals to create a pre-recorded video workshop for a range of essential life skills, including food literacy, financial literacy, household chores, parenting, and more!

We welcome experienced individuals to develop a pre-recorded video or facilitate a live half-day workshop on professional development topics such as LinkedIn/Social Media platforms when job searching; how to ask for a salary and negotiate job offers/positions; how to prepare an elevator pitch; how to read your pay stub; understanding corporate benefit packages, and more!

# COMMUNITY RESOURCES

## HMC CONNECTIONS

**HMC Connections** was founded in 1978 by volunteers from local cultural groups, who wanted to create a welcoming community for newcomers and refugees.

It began working under the Oakville Social Planning Council, incorporated in June 1980 as the Oakville Multicultural Council and in 1998 became known as the Halton Multicultural Council as it was serving all of Halton. It is now known as HMC Connections and has offices across Halton.



HMC Connections helps newcomers settle and integrate into a welcoming and inclusive community. Its vision is 'One Community for All' and its mandate is to enable all individuals, regardless of race or ethnic origin, to participate as full and active members of the community while fostering mutual respect and understanding.

HMC Connections provides services and programs to facilitate and assist the settlement and integration of immigrants and refugees to the community. It develops community education programs to increase the general awareness of the needs of immigrants and refugees and to facilitate cross-cultural communication and understanding. It creates and provides opportunities for members of various ethno-cultural groups/organizations to discuss common interests and to develop cooperative undertaking and encourages and promotes dialogue and co-operation between members and representatives of service organizations and public officials. HMC Connections encourages and facilitates development of support groups and community organizations for immigrants and refugees when possible and required. It provides cultural activities and special events designed to foster the representation of cultural heritage and to improve and develop intercultural understanding.
